Practice Gap – Hospital-based internists have very busy practices, and it is impossible for them to keep updated on all the medical advances and structural initiatives related to the myriad of clinical cases that are presented to them. This conference will address key gaps that have been found to exist in hospital-based internists' practices. These gaps were determined through literature reviews, population health data reported by the CDC and quality measurement sources (e.g., AHRQ, NQQA), and ongoing survey activities within ACOI.

Learner Needs (Knowledge/Competence) – While most hospitalists maintain a wide breadth of awareness of best practices in many areas, maintaining knowledge and skills in all, and certainly certain challenging clinical areas creates a unique challenge. ACOI's assessment using the latest guidelines, epidemiologic data and survey reports show that hospitalists need more clarity on how best to manage acute and chronic pain under current changes in policies. Successfully meeting QI mandates is another challenge. Conflicting guidelines based on special populations (e.g., hypertension in geriatric patients and those with T2DM) leaves the treator with the need for more specific guidance. Heart failure and sleep apnea are but two other areas where clearer evidence will impact physician competence and hopefully improve our comes.
