Whether attendees were onsite in Tampa, Florida or chose to participate via the virtual option, <u>ACOI 2023</u> delivered world-class medical education, hands-on learning sessions, intriguing keynotes, and a plethora of networking events. With over 50 sessions, 60 speakers, and a record number of students and residents attending, it went down in the books as another memorable Annual Convention.

This year's theme, "Health, Wellness, or Medicine?" put a spotlight on the importance of self-care for physicians. True to the theme, international fitness guru and ACOI keynote speaker, Tony Horton, passionately presented his *11 Laws that Will Change Your Life*. His enthusiasm for a fitness-focused lifestyle had attendees up on their feet, laughing, and lining up after his session to meet the famous exercise expert and best-selling author.

Point-of-Care Ultrasound (POCUS) and OMM training sessions gave participants a break from seated lectures and provided an opportunity to participate in hands-on skill building. POCUS training covered: basic POCUS techniques, Pearls POCUS, musculoskeletal, and cardiology. On Thursday night, meet-up sessions brought together old and new friends for cocktails, hors d'oeuvres, and thought-provoking discussions on topics specific to women physicians, LGBTQIA+ physicians, early career physicians, and physician wellness.

### Physician Wellness - The Art of Saying No

The expert panel included Jeffrey M. Krepps, PhD; Julie Sterbank, DO, FACOI; Angela De Hamer, DO, FACOI; David L. Tolentino, DO, FACOI; Joanne K. Baker, DO, FACOI; Christine M. Samsa, DO, FACOI, and Kristine Cooper, DO.

Framing the discussion around academic models for positive workplace functioning and wellbeing, the panel reviewed a real-life wellness case and suggested potential solutions along with welcoming questions and suggestions from audience members. Panel members noted that being highly accomplished, physicians often find it difficult to admit when they need help. Panel members stressed the importance in understanding that physicians need to be the best version of themselves before looking to care for others, a reality that is true regardless of whether you are an early-career physician or if you've been practicing for many years.

The Florida Aquarium was the perfect backdrop for the Welcome Reception where buffet stations and beverages were served. Attendees strolled through and marveled at penguins, sharks, poison dart tree frogs, and many other exotic and wild creatures while socializing with friends and colleagues.

### **High Quality CPR**

Led by Samuel Rodriguez, MD, "High Quality CPR" discussed the concept of the Arrest Cycle and explained the importance of an algorithmic approach to cardiac arrest. Dr. Rodriguez began by presenting the case of a 45-year-old man who had coronary artery stents and showed risk of coding. He discussed that the resuscitation process is most successful when there is early recognition and early defibrillation. In reviewing the adult cardiac arrest algorithm, he said data reveals that most of the time teams give rapid compressions; the problem with faster-than-recommended compressions is that the necessary depth necessary for effectiveness is typically sacrificed.

He advocated using a metronome on the monitor to assure the correct pace. He also reviewed the correct time to give epinephrine and when to consider amiodarone or lidocaine.

### **Gut Microbiome**

Charlene A. LePane DO, MSPH, FACG, FASGE, FACOI, led the discussion by explaining the facts of microbiome, where it exists and what is currently understood about it. The human body is host to trillions of microbes, collectively known as microbiome.

They can account for up to 1-3% total body mass in a human being forming a symbiotic relationship within the body.

Providing a comprehensive view of the gut microbiome, Dr. LePane emphasized that not all bacteria are harmful. She explained that the proliferation of good bacterial flora is vital for contributing to the normal functioning of the digestive system, aiding the immune system, helping to synthesize vitamins, and providing protection from carcinogens.

Anti-Inflammatory Diets: How Effective Are They?

Rheumatologist, Monica D. Shah, DO, FACR, enlightened the crowd about the efficacy of antiinflammatory diets.

As the popularity of cookbooks, articles, and online information on inflammation and anti-inflammatory diets grows in popular culture, Dr. Shah emphasized that this is a good time for physicians to understand the role of diets on chronic inflammation.

She explained the fundamentals of inflammation and its impact on human health, the difference between acute inflammation and chronic inflammation, how inflammation is measured and the dangers of inflammation. While there can be numerous causes of inflammation, including smoking, obesity, exposure to dust/chemical periodontal disease, and chronic stress, her presentation focused on the problem with inflammatory foods and the potential benefits of antiinflammatory diets.

### Friday, October 13, 2023

### Keynote: The Pros & Cons of AI in Healthcare

With recent advances in artificial intelligence (AI), the ACOI Program Committee decided there was no better time to review the concerns, thoughts, and promise of AI than live on stage at ACOI 2023. Two sides of AI's potential in medicine were presented by Humera (Mena) Kahn, MD, and Deanah Jibril, DO, MS, MBA. The physicians led Friday's featured presentation focusing on how AI is increasingly becoming an integral part of modern healthcare and the advantages and concerns it presents in diagnosing, treating, and even preventing disease.

Dr. Kahn reviewed how AI in healthcare encompasses a wide range of applications and tools designed to enhance the efficiency, accuracy, and effectiveness of healthcare services. She advocated that AI technologies offer great potential to improve a multitude of aspects of medicine, including healthcare delivery, diagnosis, treatment, and research. She listed the benefits of AI and explained to the audience that, with oversight, AI is the best way to move healthcare forward.

Representing the opposing view, Deanah Jibril, DO, MS, MBA presented her thoughts on AI and her concerns about autonomy and liability for the decisions made using machine learning. She expressed concerns that AI is basically comprised of data collection from scouring the web. She agrees that AI has the capability of speeding up decision making and can provide faster referrals.

She said it also can increase knowledge database which ultimately can mean a faster time to making a diagnosis as it sorts through the massive amounts of data inherent in the changing field of medicine.

### **Infectious Diseases: Late Breakers**

MarkAlain Dery, DO, MPH, FACOI, discussed recent updates in the world of infectious diseases (ID). The overview spanned a variety of ID concerns, including DoxyPep, PEPFAR, Hansen's Disease, Candida Auris, and avian influenza.

Dr. Dery discussed the role of DoxyPep in preventing sexually transmitted infections (STIs). Doxycycline is a class of medications traditionally used to treat bacterial STIs after someone has been infected, but recent studies indicate it can also be effective in preventing chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis infections. While physicians are typically conservative in prescribing antibiotics, he recommended that all physicians be liberal in their prescribing practice of DoxyPep given the recent evidence of effective STI prevention.

He explained the risk of not continuing to fund an international program called PEPFAR. He outlined that the current resistance in Congress is endangering the two-decade old program that has been credited in helping to slow the HIV pandemic and in saving an estimated 25 million lives.

### Saturday, October 14, 2023

Recognizing and Approaching the Impaired Physician

"When you don't offer help, you violate our oath." Thomas F. Jan, DO, certified in pain and in addiction medicine, spoke frankly to the audience gathered for his Saturday morning talk about the obligations physicians have in approaching a colleague they may believe is impaired due to drugs, alcohol, or mental illness. He reported that 8-12% of physicians will develop a substance abuse problem at some point in their careers.

During his presentation he reviewed which specialties are most at risk of abusing substances and what substance is the most abused. He noted that compared with the general population, physicians have higher rates of prescription drug abuse, particularly benzodiazepines and opioids, and that there is an increased risk for physicians to develop abuse during their residency training.



Treatment Recommendations for Use of Thiazides in Chronic Kidney Disease

David S. Levy, DO, FASN, introduced what kidney disease is and the pathophysiology, renal physiology, evidence, current guidelines, and treatment recommendations of thiazides for prevention of nephrolithiasis (kidney stones). Although not FDA approved for kidney stone prevention, thiazides have been an effective cornerstone of pharmacologic prevention of kidney stone recurrence for decades. Dr. Levy reviewed previous studies conducted in the 1980s on kidney stone prevention and the trials that established the common use of thiazide diuretics before providing a detailed review of a controversial trial published in the March 2023 edition of the *New England Journal of Medicine*. While the NEJM article challenges the traditional treatment of kidney stones with thiazides, he believes there is conclusive evidence that the decades old drug therapy is still the best treatment.
