Quality of Case Write-up	Case is well-summarized. All pertinent information is included. Shows development of the case and how it was resolved.	Case is less well-summarized. Impact	Case is relevant to current medical issues. Case clearly demonstrates how to improve quality care. Pearls of Wisdom	Unique pearls of wisdom are described and are pertinent to the case submission.	Unique pearls of wisdom are not described. OR Pearls of wisdom are not pertinent to the case submission.	There is a distinct lack of any pearls of wisdom that would benefit similar cases.	

Visual Impact	Easy to read. No grammatical or spelling errors. Visuals boost the poster. Space is utilized well.	Less easy to read. Several grammatical and/or spelling errors. Graphics are confusing or not pertinent.	Poster is too busy or too sparse. Numerous spelling and/or grammatical errors. Too many graphics or are not enough.	
Novelty of Case	Case is unique and leads to an increase in quality of care of patients and increase in knowledge for treatment.	Case is not unique OR Does not lead to an increase in the quality of care of patients.	Case is not a unique presentation AND Does not add much for quality of care.	
Overall Oral Presentation	Exhibits confidence and competency discussing the case. Establishes eye contact. Clear presentation of case, outcomes, and impact.	Less confidence and/or competency discussing the case. Partly establishes eye contact. Presentation of case, outcomes, and impact is less clear.	Poorly prepared presentation. Lack of professionalism and eye contact. Not confident in presenting the case.
